St. John's International Airport Celebrates National AccessAbility Week

ST. JOHN'S, NL – The St. John's International Airport Authority (SJIAA) is proud to celebrate National AccessAbility Week 2025 by launching two new accessibility offerings. National AccessAbility Week is designed to offer a meaningful opportunity to explore accessibility and inclusion and reaffirm a shared commitment to building a more inclusive society.

The Hidden Disabilities Sunflower is a simple tool for passengers to voluntarily share the presence of a disability or condition that may not be immediately apparent and that you may require extra assistance. In the coming weeks, lanyards, pins, and badges will be available at airline check-in counters, the Visitor Information Centre, and the Security Operations Centre. Items can also be mailed to passengers in advance of their travel.

SJIAA has also installed multiple inductive hearing loops to assist passengers with hearing aids. This loop provides a magnetic, wireless signal that is broadcasted directly to hearing aids with a T-Coil and assists in louder environments. The first phase of installation included airline check-in counters and the Visitor Information Centre.

"National AccessAbility Week is a meaningful opportunity to demonstrate our commitment of ensuring all passengers have access to safe, efficient, and equitable air travel," said Dennis Hogan, Chief Executive Officer, St. John's International Airport Authority. "We're proud to officially launch two key initiatives this week that we believe will enhance the passenger experience and offer travellers more choice and comfort as they move through the airport."

"The Autism Society is proud of its partnership with the St. John's International Airport Authority," said Paul Walsh, Chief Executive Officer, Autism Society of Newfoundland and Labrador. "From the social narrative on the airport's website to the initiatives announced today, the Airport Authority continues to build a welcoming and accessible space for all persons regardless of their life experience or particular needs. Great things happen when we work together."

"If a traveller has a hearing aid with a T-Coil, then they'll be able to turn it on to be better hear the conversation at that service point."
